I would like to acknowledge and thank David Rako for his commitment and dedication as the Berendale School President. David has been instrumental in supporting and facilitating the Katandra School and Berendale School merger as well as many other events and activities.

We welcome Andrew Mitchell as the new school President, Mario Delosa as the Vice President and Christine Asmanis as the Treasurer, as well as new member Athina Caravatas.

COVID-19 has continued to cause major staff and student disruptions. We appreciate your continued support as we work through these daily challenges and we look forward to a smoother remainder of the term.

We have been lucky to have been able to employ three new staff members. We would like to welcome Emily Jeffrey (classroom teacher of 8A), Bianca Mortimer (classroom teacher of 9A) and Julian Dutton (classroom teacher of 10A for the remainder of Term 2).

Berendale School hosted a successful Mother's Day Morning Tea in our Hospitality Building. The SBAT Catering students provided a delicious breakfast and Barista coffee. We had over 40 parents/carers attend.

Our Curriculum Day will focus on the Numeracy curriculum, and we have been fortunate to have Anna Kapnoullas who will lead the day of staff professional development.

This term we have also supported Melbourne and Monash University student teachers to complete their placements in Special Education.

Many of you will have noticed that the fence has finally been started. I think you will agree it's looking great and should be finished over the next couple of weeks. We are hoping the new shade sail will be installed soon.

We have also been busy undertaking school tours for potential incoming Year 7 students and looking forward to our upcoming Open Night, Careers and Community Expo on Thursday 2nd June.





KATANDRA SCHOOL & BERENDALE SCHOOL

Berendale School and Katandra School have received at least \$12.188 million in the 2022-23 State Budget to deliver stage 1 of the merger.

THE PROJECT SO FAR

Provision study

- In the 2020-21 State Budget, the project for Katandra School and Berendale School received \$500,000 to support a planning and specialist provision study of the schools.
- The school leadership team, school council and architects worked with the department to develop options for the future that would best meet the needs of the two school communities.
- · The possible options for the schools included:
 - Conventional co-location both schools operating independently from the one site
 - Advanced co-location both schools operate independently from the one site and share facilities such as administration, community and outdoor play spaces
 - Merger schools have shared facilities and operate as one school under a single governance model, allowing for optimal use of the site
 - Stay schools remain as they are for the foreseeable future
- To determine the best possible option for the two schools, the study:
 - Consulted with both schools to identify the options and explore the advantages and disadvantages of each
 - Explored what facilities best meet the future student needs and whether these facilities could sit within one school site
 - Identified current capacity, future growth and broader provision
 - Examined an appropriate governance model
- In September 2021, both school councils unanimously endorsed the option to merge Katandra and Berendale schools on the Berendale School site with the support of the Department of Education and Training.

Masterplanning

- The Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA), regional office and two schools worked with Kneeler Design Architects to develop a masterplan based on a proposed merger. This masterplan was endorsed by both school councils in December 2021
- The VSBA has continued to meet with principals, school councils and staff to ensure their needs and feedback were reflected in the planning of the stage 1.
- Both schools, the architect and VSBA, have been further working to progress the design process in 2022.

NEXT STEPS FOR THE PROJECT

- Berendale School and Katandra School have received at least \$12.188 million in the 2022-23 State Budget to deliver stage 1 of the merger.
 - This will include two new buildings that include classrooms, resource intensive learning spaces, library, staff areas and administration spaces.
 - The new buildings include a single storey junior learning hub and double storey middle learning building including STEAM.
- With the approval of stage 1 funding, this will allow the opportunity to commence the bringing together of both schools as a single entity on the Brendale site.
- In the coming months, the design will be finalised and tender will be sought for a builder.

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 The VSBA will regularly update both communities on timelines and works as the construction start date draws closer.

BENEFITS OF THE PROJECT

- This merger is an exciting time for the future of both Katandra and Berendale Schools communities.
- Planning for the merger highlighted the potential for greater opportunities for both schools' staff and students.
- We know from other school mergers that students gain greater learning opportunities and a richer curriculum offering. Additionally, staff gain greater professional learning and development opportunities. This leads to improved engagement with students as they move through year levels

 allowing for a better understanding of their learning needs and making the transition through stages of learning students easier.
- Families, parents and carers gain a greater understanding of their child's learning and achievements through a unified curriculum and have closer access to teachers, support staff and paraprofessionals.

Anthony topped up the garden bed with some leftover soil from the compost bins




Cooper and Conor collected the old vertical garden panels


ArtVo Excursion
